Francis Harrison

Wednesday, May 24th, 1895, Nicholas Harrison, after three weeks of intense suffering, died of kidney trouble at the home of F. M. Harrison, four miles northeast of Shelbina. His father died in 1855 and Nicholas, being the oldest became the head of the family, and remained with his mother until her death in 1863. Thus another link between the present and the first settlers of this country is severed, and another pioneer is called home.
