Cheresa Stelle's dress was worn by her great-great-aunt, Mary Mate Douglas, on her wedding day on January 13, 1897. It was made and designed by her. Cheresa's wedding band also belonged to her great-great-aunt.

Lois Wood Song: "While Strolling Through The Park" Lois wears a black dress and hat given to her by Lena Carmichael which belonged to Lena's mother. The white lace collar and cuff were added later. She wears her Mother-In-Law's high top shoes.

Clara Runyon models her mother, Maria Schwada's black dress and spats. Walking with her is Pete Greening in an authentic three-piece black suit with tails and high top hat. With them is Pete's granddaughter, Haley Sue Saalborn in a black and white gingham dress and old black high top shoes. Her doll was owned by Pauline Hawkins.

Kathleen Wilham models a black lace shirt waist blouse and black skirt of the late Mrs. V.L. Drains. Walking with her is Jennifer Smith wearing an old navy stlR with red trim. Her doll wears an early 1900 baby coat from the Lloyd Collins family. The doll's hat was Elzena Rathjen's.

Rose Shuck wears Mary Alice Bunney's 1927 prom dress, her fur stole belonged to Nyla Conrad's mother, Elzena Rathjen.
