

Few people remember that there ever was such a town as Jonesburg. It exists no more except that the plat is still a legal fact, in conveying the land, it had to be described as lots one, two & three in Jonesburg, which town was owned until this sale, entirely owned by Thomas Spader.

The town of Jonesboro was laid out by Gabriel Jones, grandfather of Mrs. J. H. Wood, formerly of Shelbina, now of Canton, Mo. He laid out the town in 1836 as a rival of the Town of Old Clinton, then an aspiring hamlet of Washington twp. & separated from it only by a road or alleyway. Both towns were thriving trading points until the N. & St. Jo r.r. was built in 1857, when Hunnewell, Lakenan & Shelbina took the trade from the "twin" towns. Old Clinton, however, still exists, its official name, when it was a post office, being North Fork.

The first Methodist Church in the county was org. at Clinton by Wm. Fowler, John Strayer, Adam Hickard, Wm. Henninger & Henry Ashcraft, with their families, & was followed shortly by the ever-increasing "Campbelites" with a church organization in Jonesburg just across the alley. Among the first members of the church were James Dean, John & Drury Ragsdale & Robert Nesbit.

June 11, 1919 *sp* Pioneer Citizen Dies - One of the pioneer citizens of *Mo* passed to the better land Fri, Jun 6 when Judge Newton Adams slipped gently away in his sleep, aged 76 yrs, 5 mos. & 6 days.

He was b. in Henry Co., Ky., Jan 1, 1823, & came to *Mo* in 1850, settling on a 240-a. unimproved farm on Crooked Cr., 5 mi S of *Shna*. He improved this place & lived there until 1864, when he moved to Shelbina, residing here until 1883, when he bought a farm abt 6 SW of town. After abt 10 yrs he took his family to Columbia to receive the benefits of a college education. 2 yrs later he returned here & bought a farm abt a mile S of *Shna*, where he resided, until he gave up farming & moved to town again in 1906, living since that time a quiet life.

In 1871, he was appointed to fill out an unexpired term as a member of the county court of Shelby County & was elected another term. In *Mo* he was a justice of the peace & served one yr as assessor.

He was a believer in higher education & gave his children all the advantage in the line that he could afford. He reared them with high principles & they are held in highest esteem in their respective communities. He was a Presbyterian in faith & was a charter member of the Shelbina Presbyterian Ch.

Judge Adams m. *Mrs* Martha ^{Sparks} *Sparks*, also a Kentuckian by birth, in 1851, & 10 ch were born to their union, seven of whom survive, as follows: *Mrs* J. C. Combs, *Mrs* W. B. Williamson, *Mrs* C. H. Magruder & Otis Adams of this vicinity; Newton J. Adams of Jerome, Idaho; *Mrs* H. J. Herling of St. L.; & Miss Irene Adams of Kansas City.

He came of a long lived, active family, all of whom were good citizens of *Mo* & Ky. Maj. Preston Adams & Thornton Adams, brothers of the deceased, d abt 12 yrs ago, both of them

he read. He completed his studies at Obua Public Schools & attended
the State U. Sys, after which he read law in ope of his father,
W. O. L. Jewett & was admitted to the bar.

He soon dropped the practice of law, however, as his mind was
essentially a business one, & engaged in the real estate, loan &
insurance business, in which lines he was a leader in the co.

He acquired farm lands & was enthusiastic in their improve-
ment & more intensive cultivation. He loved to see things grow.

In 1897 he m. Miss Ella Law of nr Bethel, who survives him,
& they went to Texas expecting to make their home. But Howell did
not like to live among strangers; as he frequently said in later
years when urged to seek a milder climate: "I don't want to live
anywhere I can't greet every person I meet as my friend."

His love of children was beautiful. He taught the neighborhood
& those of his farm tenants to call him "Daddy Howell." Nephews
born into his home, but his wife's nephew, Robert Corwin, became
a member of his family at the age of 4 yrs, upon the death of the
boy's mother, & on him Howell lavished his affection.

For almost 10 yrs prior to his death, he was a victim of kidney
disease & acute attacks of a more or more, once or twice a yr,
stretched him upon a bed of pain; but no one ever heard ^{him} complain.

In the funeral discourse delivered by Rev. G. B. Culbertson of Macon,
a friend of the family for more than 30 yrs, he said in part:

"When disease had weakened his body, & his will he was not the
strong Howell Jewett of his manly & robust yrs. Especially was this
true of the last few months of his life. His physician & others of us
who knew him best could see the battle he waged while the odds
were against him. Old ^{Dr.} Joseph Parker sd a great truth when
he declared: 'Men are not to be judged by a single act but by the
sum total, not condemned for one wrong deed but judged over

rather by what they would be.

"It is with especial joy that I learn of the triumphal hours of Howell's closing. He called to his bed-side those who loved him best & whom he loved best & with a manly confession, (all who know Howell know how much it meant for Howell Jewett to make such a statement.) he took all blame to himself, exonerating his family & his wife. 'It is all my fault,' he sd. 'I am now ready to go.' We all know that preceding this confession to men was made that greater confession to his Lord & Savior who is ever ready to forgive & save.

"Such was the closing of our Ben on these earthly scenes.

"It would be untrue to you on this occasion were I to fail in speaking here of the power of Prayer. Howell had a godly father & mother. We often sing in the little song of how mother's prayers hold on to us. That queenly, Christian woman, separated so many miles from us today, & thus making a physical impossibility for her to be present, had a mountain of prayers in God's heavenly bank & like Jacob of old, they prevailed.

"Mothers, let me say to you here today 'Don't give up praying! God will hear your prayers.'"

The funeral discourse was based on the words of Hosea 9:5, which the prophet pressed home upon the idolaters, who would be deprived of their religious privileges by their captors.

"What Will I Do in the Solemn Day."
